Guide dog

is exceptional means for vision impaired and blind people rehabilitation. For the 50-year history of guide dog training in Russia about 4000 dogs were granted to blind people. Our Centre has been operating for 20 years though officially it was established in 2003. The centre is a not-for-profit organization created on the initiative and under immediate action of expert guide dog instructors who take great interest in maintaining and developing the guide dog training legacy.

Therapy Dogs

for children with special needs is another direction of our work. The Therapy Dogs give special children a wonderful chance to improve their abilities and talents that are not evident for the kids' families and doctors. The Therapy Dogs become a pathfinder showing the kids into the outer environment and helping them find a place in the world.



Our work

We acquire either by purchase or as a gift young Golden retrievers and Labradors, sometimes even pups. Only the best of them – calm, brave, clever – will become Guide Dogs for visually impaired people and Therapy Dogs for special kids. Naturally we put much effort in primary dog behavior testing before the start of the training.

Training



Training a dog is an extended process. We make sure that for the training period the dog lives in proper conditions. Volunteer families provide us assistance with that. So thanks to them the dogs enjoy all necessary care, attention and love.

Our instructors are experienced professionals who teach the dogs every aspect of their future work.

After the dog passes an exam successfully it meets a new owner. We select the two very carefully as they must match each other as much as possible. Their training sessions together and with help of the instructor will bring them to a better understanding of one another.



Therapy Dogs' training programs are based on the specific needs of an individual child. The most crucial and difficult part of the program is common training for the child, the family and the dog.



Guide Dog's skills

Since long ago people know and use dog's remarkable ability to remember its way and find the way back home.

Today, too, the primary task of the Guide Dog is to remember regular routes of the owner and take him or her along, not letting the person wander away...

...Another task

is to ensure safety of the traveling visually impaired person.

Modern Guide Dog is trained for many things. It is well adapted for work in a noisy hectic city where it guides its owner along crowded streets and prevents him/her from being pushed. It warns about any obstacles, leads the person across highways and can find a stairway, right door or a bench.



Sometimes it is only after receiving a Guide Dog blind people can go out after many years of staying home.



The dog is a cheerful and energetic animal and it helps people who lost their sight to overcome their psychological problems.

The Guide Dog links the blind and the world of people capable of seeing. The dog attracting friendly interest of people around urges everybody to pay greater attention to its owner's needs.

Despite difficult work, our dogs are still happy and playful.
